WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AND EDUCATION

Kansas City's economic success depends on providing an educated and ready workforce to fill the needs in our community and attract new employers to the region. The KC Chamber and Civic Council support policies to improve quality education opportunities for Pre-K-20, reduce barriers to employment and encourage participation in the regional workforce. Policies should foster full employment and a quality and able workforce ready for the 21st Century economy and enhance the greater Kansas City region as a hub for attracting world-class talent.

FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

In an increasingly complex 21st century economy, the KC Chamber and Civic Council call for a climate of legislative and regulatory stability, predictability, and efficiency allowing businesses to plan for growth and expansion including measures below:

• Support measures to ensure that all necessary actions are taken to ensure the state is eligible to receive all allocated federal infrastructure funds from the Bipartisan Infrastructure bill and the American Rescue Plan Act.

We support the preservation of local authority for local taxation and spending decisions.

MEDICAID EXPANSION
